United Way's Day of Caring strives to bring together energetic volunteers to complete community service projects at local non-profit agencies in Adams County. Day of Caring projects involve a variety of services and may include painting, landscaping, gardening, cleaning, organizing, and more. We would like to invite your organization to submit a project and take part in this great event. Day of Caring is completely free of charge to non-profit organizations in Adams County. Admission to the Day of Caring will be **based upon the number of volunteer work teams available** and will be assigned on a **first-come-first-serve basis**, so get your project application in early!

The volunteer team that is assigned to your project will be announced closer to the event date. I have enclosed a project application for you to submit – you can fill the application out electronically and turn in to me via email or mail/on paper (email is preferred).

A few things to keep in mind for the Day of Caring on September 12th:

- A representative from your agency is required to be present at the kick-off breakfast at 8:00am on Sept. 12. Kick-off will be held at the United Way office at 1863 Gettysburg Village Dr. Suite #920
- Please indicate **who your agency representative** will be, along with **contact information** (email and phone) AND **t-shirt size**.
- Representatives will be connected with the team leader and must accompany the volunteers at the project site from start to finish.
- Projects should be relatively simple, meaning that most anyone can perform the work being requested – volunteer teams most likely will not have skilled laborers or contractors on their rosters.
